• Wednesday August 9, 7 - 9 pm. Flower Pounding & Stitching with Linda Bull. Linda is picking up on taking our initial experiments further toward finished works by adding complexity to the surface.

Supply List from Linda Bull & Donna Kendall:

- Fabrics white or light colours that are "prepared for dyeing (PFD)" –
 White fabric 8 by 10 or so.
- Fresh plant material that excites you to make images from;
 Some flowers and leaves pansy rose petals petunia, etc.
- A small hammer or mallet
- Anything you have doing a small project
- Needles thread to colour your posy prints
- Donna will bring extra needles and threads if you don't have them.

Please let us know if you plan to participate for extra supply planning. All Members are welcome to come to this regular meeting.

This month includes "WHAT IF?" from 2 to 4 pm. in the Textile Room at Casa.

• Saturday August 26, 1 - 4 pm. Natural Dyeing for Fabric & Yarn/Thread with Lynne Hunter-Johnston & Carol Schuld. Summer and early Fall are the best times to gather plant materials to make pots of colour for fabric, yarn and even raw fleece. Discover the amazing selections surrounding you from your garden, different woods, and even kitchen spices. Carol has just finished a stunning sample binder using natural dye powders from Maiwa. Lynne learned this as a spinner and weaver and in conjunction with historic textile research over 40 years ago.

Supplies to bring:

- sample size fabrics and/or yarn/thread in white or light colours that are "prepared for dyeing (PFD)"
- Fresh or dried plant material. It takes a lot to make a strong vat so here are some suggestions for group vats:

*** Start collecting these suggested easy starters now for the pots: onion skins (separate red & yellow please), marigold heads, carrot tops, sumac
